
The Pennsylvania Pregnancy and Parenting Support Services Program





Measurable Program Outcomes

- Women increasingly choose childbirth rather than abortion.
- Increased physical and emotional support provided to women.
- Increased knowledge of adoption.
- Improved parenting outcomes.
- Improved reproductive health due to STD education and modification of risky lifestyle behavior through abstinence education.
- Lowered infant mortality, as well as, health and Medicaid costs due to high client pre-natal care rates, pediatric care rates, and immunization rates.

Program at a Glance

- 1. 27+ year statewide government-funded program providing alternatives to abortion!
 - Privatized social services program DHS hires Real Alternatives to administer statewide program that promotes childbirth rather than abortion.
 - 29 Real Alternatives funded Service Providers (82 centers) throughout PA provide life-affirming comprehensive, compassionate, caring counseling, and support to Pennsylvania women experiencing unexpected pregnancies.
 - Centers consist of 33 Catholic Charities sites, 33 Pregnancy Support Centers, 9 Maternity Homes, 6 Social Service Agencies, and 1 Adoption Agency that provide free support services to women who are pregnant, think they might be pregnant, or have a child under one.
 - Currently funded at \$7.263 million/year
 - Through modern business practices, the program's latest administrative cost is a low 8.8% in FY22-23.
 - Over 10,638 women served last fiscal year throughout Pennsylvania.
- 2. First and only statewide Faith-Based program funded in PA.
 - Over 354,292 women served in over 27 years.
- In FY22/23, CDC estimated cost savings for program clients receiving proper prenatal care = \$301,499,000
- In FY22/23, CDC estimated cost savings for program clients' children up to date immunizations = \$198,489,000


INFANT MORTALITY

The Pennsylvania Pregnancy & Parenting Support Services Program

Measurable Program Outcomes

- · Women gain increased self-sufficiency
- Improved parenting skills
- Lowered infant mortality, as well as, health and Medicaid costs due to high client prenatal care rates, pediatric care rates, and immunization rates.
- Proper prenatal care vastly reduces possibility of low birthweight infants and subsequent death. CDC states that \$26,941 in each instance could be saved by preventing low birthweight in infants. In FY22/23 alone, program counselors assisted 11,191 clients in obtaining proper prenatal care for their infants. That savings could potentially be \$301,499,529!
- CDC states immunizations save \$30.41 per dollar spent in medical and societal costs. The cost of immunizations is approx. \$961.99 per child. In FY22/23, 6,785 program clients' children's immunizations were up-to-date. That translates into a potential cost savings of \$198,489,176!


Client Feels Confident and Capable of Self-Sufficiency After Program Services

Program at a Glance

- In 1995 Pennsylvania created a governmentfunded program to provide statewide pregnancy support and parenting education services to Pennsylvania women!
 - Program funding increased to the current level of \$7.26 million per year in 2017.
 - From 2000 to 2020 the infant mortality rate in Pennsylvania has dropped from 7.3 per 1,000 live births to 5.5
- Twenty-nine (29) Real Alternatives funded Service Providers (82 sites) throughout Pennsylvania
 - Sites consist of 30 pregnancy centers, 35 social service agencies, 12 maternity homes, and 3 adoption agencies.
 - Approximately 258 caring and compassionate counselors provide services in all 67 PA counties
 - 354,292 women seen at 1,898,249 visits (through December 2023)
- 3. Support services to new mothers include counseling, shelter, food, clothing, parenting education, adoption information, and referrals to other community agencies for women who have a child under 12 months old
 - Women are empowered to make choices that greatly improve infant health and survival
 - Service Provider vendors are reimbursed on a fee-for-services basis for approved services rendered
 - Funding is not freely given, it is earned
 - Annual contract compliance monitorings are conducted of every Service Provider


